The Grosse Pointe Academy was founded in 1885 by the Society of the Sacred Heart, a French order of cloistered Catholic nuns. The Grosse Pointe Academy was incorporated in 1969 as an independent, non-profit, coed PK-8 school. Sitting on a 20-acre lakeside campus, the Academy provides a student-centered education, promoting critical thinking, problem-solving, and communication skills. The low teacher-student ratio allows the school to concentrate on core academics, while offering electives with real-life application. The early school is the longest continuously operating Montessori program in Michigan. The Grosse Pointe Academy is located 10-15 miles Northeast from downtown Detroit. Take Interstate 94 East - Exit 224A towards Moross Road. Turn right on Moross Road and travel about 2.4 miles until Moross ends at Lake Shore Road. Turn right on Lake Shore and go 0.9 miles. Enter using the Lake Shore Entrance. Parking is along the fence between our school and St. Paul Catholic Church.
