



## Independence in All Areas...

### Life Skills (taking care of basic needs)

- Provide a strong routine.
- Give students responsibilities. (JOBS)
- · Promote independent activities. (shoe tying, etc.)

### Learning Skills (success at school)

- · Provide home "fun" activities to get parents involved..
- Encourage "self-initiated, self-directed" activities."

### Social Skills (interacting with others)

- · Encourage social interaction in different settings.
- · Help students work through their problems Don't RESCUE.

### Emotional Skills (regulating/expressing feelings)

- · Label and express emotions empathize, don't sympathize.
- Allow for appropriate expression of all emotions.
- · Modeling of healthy emotions by adults is critical.

### Behavioral Skills (making good choices)

- · Provide structure and learning opportunities.
- · Allow children to learn from their choices.
- · Give more encouragement and less rewards.
