Rodney Glasgow is a facilitator in the areas of diversity, equity, and social justice. He is one of the founding members and now chair of the National Association of Independent School's (NAIS) Annual Student Diversity Leadership Conference, while also having served as a member of Call-to-Action, the advisory board to the vice president of equity and justice for NAIS. A graduate of Harvard University with a joint degree in Afro-American studies and psychology, and holding a master of arts in organization and leadership from Columbia University, he is also an independent school alum, having graduated from Gilman School. He founded the National Diversity Practitioners Institute, an intensive professional development program for diversity practitioners in independent schools. Glasgow has been the diversity coordinator at Graland Country Day School, assistant head of upper school and director of diversity for Worcester Academy, and is currently the head of middle school and chief diversity officer at St. Andrew's Episcopal School in Maryland.
